Fellow Penncross Residents...

Thanks to our president, Kajal who took the time to represent our subdivision at the meeting regarding the sound wall on September 8. Please see his recap below and share this outcome with your neighbors who reside within this section of Penncross Knoll who will be directly impacted. The next meeting is scheduled for October 4 and is the LAST opportunity for your voice to be heard. We encourage our residents to attend the final meeting.

September 8, 2022 - 248th Avenue Road Improvement Project Update

The Naperville City Hall meeting concluded today to discuss the 248th Avenue sound wall. The City project engineers gave a technical presentation around the noise analysis and design parameters.

The Penncross Knoll HOA sent letters to the residents with homes along 248th Avenue. These homes would be directly impacted by the future traffic projected with the expansion. Only two residents living at 3363 Hollis Circle and 3367 Hollis Circle were present to voice their concern.

As the President of the Penncross Knoll subdivision, I questioned the noise study and put a case to demand for a correction to the 2050 traffic projections for the noise analysis. The point was also emphasized that with the future traffic generator, the reflective noise effect of the sound walls across the street and the four lane traffic, it would be extremely unfair to the residents to deny our homes of the sound wall. A request was made that the City reconsider their decision and provide approval of the sound walls for the Penncross Knoll subdivision.

October 4 is scheduled to be the FINAL day when the City Council will hear from residents who live alongside 248th Avenue warranting the need for a noise wall. **For the record, this is our last chance to make your voices heard.** The impact to such discussions at the City level are greater when affected residents are involved.

This is a final plea to the residents living at the following addresses to show up at the October 4 meeting at City Hall (Naperville Municipal Center at 400 S. Eagle Street) and express your concerns.

HYDRANGEA SEASON IS HERE!

The Growing Place

Al fresco dining, novels spread across hammocks, lounging poolside, long sun-filled days, and gardens bursting with color...Summer is in full swing—hot, hazy, and a bit lazy. And with it are the stunning clusters of elegant hydrangeas, one of the few shrubs flowering this time of year.

Available in a variety of shapes, sizes, and hues – from shimmering white, mint green, and baby pink cone-shaped bunches to bold purple and blue mopheads—hydrangeas (also known as hortensia) complement any garden. While also available as vines and growing trees, the most common type of the hydrangea—native to North America and parts of Asia – is the shrub that thrives in partial shade to full sun. Most buds form in late spring and blossom in June and July.

The Growing Place offers an assortment of this ever-popular plant to suit your unique gardening arrangements, including Panicle Hydrangea (*Hydrangea paniculata*), Bigleaf Hydrangea (*Hydrangea macrophylla*), Smooth Hydrangea (*Hydrangea aborescens*), Oakleaf Hydrangea (*Hydrangea quercifolia*), and Mountain Hydrangea (*Hydrangea serrata*). Each has its own needs for planting, sun, watering, pruning, and overall care.

PANICLE HYDRANGEA OR HYDRANGEA PANICULATA

One of the hardiest of the hydrangea family, the Panicle Hydrangea, which begins blooming in summer, is known for its interesting color palette of pale pink to chartreuse to white. Available 3'-10' tall as well as in tree form, while this cone-shaped variety thrives best in moist, well-drained soil with a good balance of sand, silt, and clay, it does especially well with our more alkaline Illinois zone 5 soil. As summer ebbs and fall sets in, the Panicle Hydrangea's color gradually changes to lovely tints of yellow, orange, and rose.

BIGLEAF HYDRANGEA OR HYDRANGEA MACROPHYLLA

The Bigleaf Hydrangea may just be one of the most photographed of the hydrangea family, boasting big, beautiful bunches of round flowers in bright pink, lavender, purple, and blue that bloom early to mid-summer.

Bigleaf Hydrangeas are healthiest in the morning sun with

afternoon shade and moist soil. The bluish versions flourish in acidic soil. Due to the more alkaline soil here in northern Illinois, achieving that blue/lavender plume may prove difficult yet many still try. If that's you—we recommend that a mixture of Espoma® Soil Acidifier and an organic mixture (perhaps pine needles and decomposed oak leaves).

SMOOTH HYDRANGEA OR HYDRANGEA ABORESCENS

Known for their dainty lace-like flowers and long bloom time, these flat or large mophead-style hydrangeas are a unique addition to any garden. They begin flowering in early summer with green bouquets that turn pink or white and convert back to green by the end of July. The Smooth Hydrangea eventually turns brown and is ideal for dried indoor arrangements throughout the winter. An adaptable variety, Smooth Hydrangeas thrive best in shade yet tolerate sun with sufficient watering.

OAKLEAF HYDRANGEA OR HYDRANGEA QUERCIFOLIA

Native to the woodlands of the southeastern US, the coarse-textured Oakleaf Hydrangea is cone-shaped with flowers that bloom winter white and change to rich shades of pink/mauve then red, burgundy and brown. Flowering from early to mid-summer, this 2'-6' shrub provides stunning foliage and warm fall tones.

Requiring a moist, well-drained soil, the Oakleaf Hydrangea blossoms best in shade and partial sun. For maximum growth, color, and vibrancy, we recommend pruning after flowering.

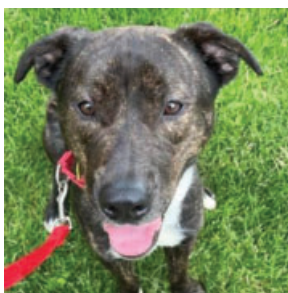

Apple orchards make *fun* outings...

Does anything taste better than a crisp, ripe apple, fresh from the tree? Not really, and unless you have trees in your backyard, the only way to get a just-picked apple is to visit your local orchard and do it yourself.

Decide when you should plan your visit. Earlier is better -- many orchards are picked clean before the official end of the season because it's such a popular activity. You should also consider when different varieties will be available. Call your preferred orchard or visit their website to see if they have that information available. Most orchards are only open to the public on weekends, so don't count on stopping by on a weekday.

Before you bring home more apples than you can possibly eat, consider how much you really want and what you might do with them. Are they all destined for lunchboxes? Is there an apple pie recipe or three you can try? Do you plan to cook a bushel down to make homemade applesauce?

When you head to the orchard, visit only the designated rows of trees that have been opened for picking. Look at apples closest to the outside of the tree -- those ripen first. The right color depends on the variety, and the orchard may provide pictures for reference. If not, just look them up on your phone.

When you start picking, lift the apple away from the branch and give it a little twist to release it. Don't pull -- you want the stem to remain on the fruit to help it last longer. Inspect the apple for any nicks or bruises, then place it gently (don't drop it) into your basket or bag. If you pick an apple and then accidentally drop it on the ground, it's still fine to pick up, but don't collect any apples that were already on the ground.

EARLY, MID AND LATE SEPTEMBER APPLE PICKING

McIntosh Apple

McIntosh apples are small to medium in size with a bright red skin. Sweet and Tart in flavor. They are great for baking and eating.

Gala Apple

Gala apples are small to medium in size with a yellow-pinkish skin. Sweet and juicy. A good dessert apple. Great for eating and salads.

Honeycrisp Apple

Honeycrisp apples are larger in size with a red and green skin. Juicy, sweet and crisp. A good dessert apple. Great for eating! The Honeycrisp has proven to be a huge success in the apple world and is one of the top three apple varieties in the country in terms of volume. The Honeycrisp is a near

perfect raw apple. It is incredibly crisp and boasts a delicate sweet-tart balance with a light berry flavor. It has an amazing color, bright crimson and rich chartreuse. In addition to being an outstanding apple, it has an amazing storage life. If stored properly, this apple will remain fresh for months.

Autumn Crisp Apple

Autumn Crisp apples are small to medium in size with a yellow-red skin. Sweet-tart, crispy and juicy. Great for eating, cooking and salads.

Blondee Apple

Blondee apples are small to medium in size with a yellow skinned Gala type. Sweet and crunchy. Great for eating and salads.

Fuji Apple

Fuji apples are large in size with a reddish-pink skin. Sweet. Great for eating and salads.

Ambrosia Apple

Ambrosia apples are pink to red blush over a yellow background color. The flavor is sweet and very pleasant and texture is crisp.

Macoun Apple

Macoun apples are red with a thin skin. Juicy and aromatic. They are great for eating and baking.

Golden Supreme Apple

Golden Supreme apples are medium in size. Sweet. Great for eating, salads and sauce.

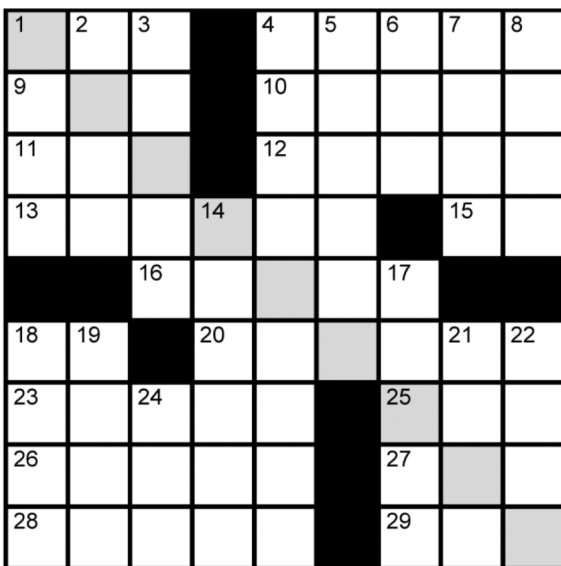

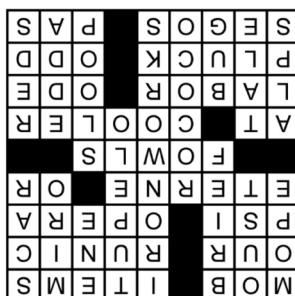

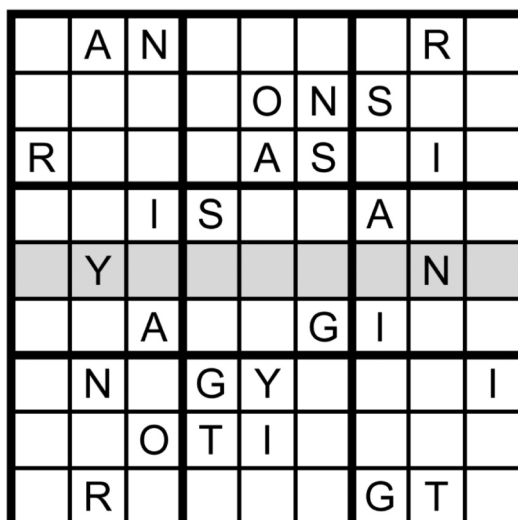

GYRATIONS Wordoku

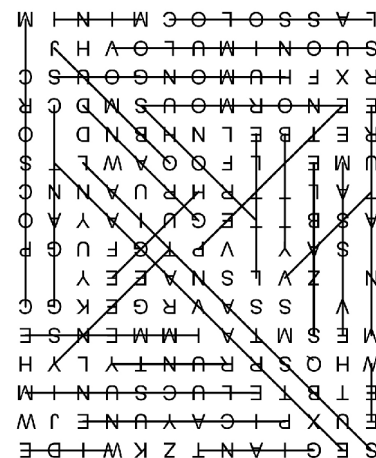
How to solve wordoku puzzles

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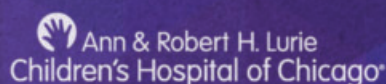
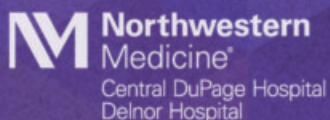
